THE KANSAS HUMANITIES COUNCIL is pleased to announce an exclusive Kansas tour of *Water/Ways*, a traveling exhibition from the Smithsonian Institution. Six venues are needed to host this Smithsonian exhibition for six weeks starting in June 2017.

Water/Ways focuses on the numerous relationships between people and water. How has water shaped our history and traditions? How does it impact our daily life? What does the future hold for water?

The Water/Ways exhibition includes:

- 5 stand-alone kiosks
- Colorful photographs and labels
- Audio clips
- Video clips
- Hands-on activities
- Ipad interactives

How to Become a Host for Water/Ways

KHC invites museums, nature centers, public libraries, art centers and other nonprofit cultural organizations to apply. Experience with traveling exhibitions is not essential to a successful application. Eligible applicants will:

- Be located in a community with a population below 20,000.
- Provide :
 - \circ a minimum of 700 square feet of display space for the Smithsonian exhibition
 - o additional space for an exhibition telling the local story
 - o a ceiling height of at least 8 1/2 feet
 - o four functional electrical outlets in the display space
 - o crate storage
- Provide limited security during the exhibition's stay.
- Have convenient hours that are open to the public (All sites are requested to be open minimum of 20 hours/week during *Water/Ways*, but the more the better).
- Tell a unique local story that ties in with the theme of *Water/Ways* that will be the basis for a locally produced companion exhibition.
- Demonstrate ideas for strong public humanities programming.
- Have a history of partnerships among organizations in the community or region.

If eligible, please fill out the application on pages 3 & 4.

The six sites selected to host the *Water/Ways* Smithsonian exhibition will receive:

- Free rental of the Smithsonian Institution traveling exhibition.
- An exhibition support manual and assistance in exhibition and program planning.
- Publicity materials such as posters, brochures, press kits, banner, PSAs, and a tour website.
- \$2,000 in funding support from KHC for development of the local companion exhibition, public humanities events, and local publicity and promotions.
- Two complementary humanities presentations about water from KHC.
- Statewide publicity and promotion.
- Expertise of and consultation from statewide water experts and museum professionals.

Sites selected to host the *Water/Ways* Smithsonian exhibition will:

- Provide a one-time cash fee of \$200 to KHC to help offset shipping costs.
- Assign a project director for the exhibition who will attend two statewide planning meetings and coordinate the project from beginning to end.
- Implement publicity in your local community and region in cooperation with KHC.
- Produce a local companion exhibition and host two public humanities programs about water from KHC.
- Host a grand opening/ribbon cutting and invite public officials, media, legislators, congressional representatives, and others.
- Provide a cost share report at the project's conclusion tracking all staff and volunteer time, facility expenses, and other donated resources.
- Provide a secure, dry space to store empty exhibition crates for the duration of the exhibition.
- Engage in cooperative publicity with Partner Sites (see explanation below).
- Contribute hard work and some out-of-pocket expenses.

Can't host the National Exhibition, but still Interested in the Water/Ways initiative?

KHC will select additional nonprofit organizations to become Partner Sites. Partner Sites will receive small grants of up to \$1,500 to explore community stories related to themes in the *Water/Ways* exhibition. However, please note that the Smithsonian exhibition will not be on display at any Partner Site. **If you indicate interest** in becoming a Partner Site on page 4, KHC staff will follow up with additional details. - 8. Describe the facility where the *Water/Ways* exhibition will be displayed. Please indicate:
 - Number of square footage in exhibition space minimum of 700 square feet required for the Smithsonian exhibition, plus additional onsite space for the local companion exhibition.
 - Ceiling height, measured from floor to ceiling minimum of 8 1/2 feet required.
 - Whether or not the space has at least four working electrical outlets exhibition contains three video components and an iPad stand that requires electricity.
 - Ability to provide limited security one-person is onsite when the exhibition is open to the public.
- 9. Identify at least 2 other organizations that will contribute to the success of this project. Attach letters of support. A letter from the local CVB or equivalent is required.

- 10. Tell why your organization would like to host the *Water/Ways* exhibition. Please indicate how the community would benefit from the Smithsonian exhibition and programs.
- 11. Describe your plans for a grand opening/ribbon cutting. Who would be invited? How would you publicize the event?
- 12. In 300 words, tell your community's water story and describe how you would interpret this story in a local companion exhibition to the *Water/Ways* Smithsonian exhibition. Stories should demonstrate Kansans' relationship with water: weather events (floods, droughts), recreation, reservoirs, settlement patterns, access to clean water, water traditions and folklore, livelihoods related to water, agriculture and water, and other similar topics.
- 13. As a host of *Water/Ways*, you will receive two complementary public programs from KHC. Describe your initial plans for additional complementary public programs that extend the *Water/Ways* theme into your community. What topics interest you? What format? (Examples: guest speakers, film or book discussions, oral history projects, community forums, etc.)
